About HKCNP



Vision

Our Lord has heard the cry of the underprivileged people in Hong Kong, it's He who calls His people, sends them into communities of the poor: walk humbly with God, act justly and love mercy; speak according to the truth, act from a caring heart to manifest the witness of our church in trinity.

Mission

Founded by Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, Hong Kong Christian Council, Hong Kong Church Renewal Movement, frontline Christian agencies and churches which care for the poor, "Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor" (HKCNP) is a well-established network and community network platform which cares for the poor, delivers services and transforms the community collaboratively with partners. We are committed to identifying service gaps and developing multiple pilot schemes in response to the needs with our partner churches. With an emphasis on capacity building, empowerment and mentorship, HKCNP provides reliable services which combine knowledge and caring. We help and empower our frontline partners to expand services and be in contact with more deprived groups by consolidating community network resources, so the churches can deliver poverty caring work and achieve God's kingdom mission in the community more effectively.

Positioning

"Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor" is a network and platform which connects our partners. As an institute which serves the underprivileged, instead of providing services directly, we render services through our partner churches, enterprises, schools and institutes.

History of HKCNP

The networking mission of Kingdom

Seed Stage Starting from social vision caring

- 1997** The pastors in the network prayed together for Hong Kong and shared visions
- 2002** The "Church Campaign for the Unemployed" was established to educate the public and promote the idea of poverty caring
- 2006** The "Church Campaign for the Unemployed" undertook transformation and was renamed as "Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor"
- 2007** A pilot scheme, which was later developed into the Child Development Fund Mentorship Program, was launched to respond to the problem of inter-generational poverty.
- 2008** "The Hong Kong Church Network For The Poor Company Ltd" was officially incorporated
- 2010** The Food Bank ministry was commenced. Stronger partnerships with churches were fostered to build social capital.

Growth Stage Finding partners and building a network

- 2012** Responded to the call for International Day for the Eradication of Poverty, promoted the "10.10.10 Anti-Poverty Campaign" and "Oct 17 Fast-a-Meal"
- 2013** An advisory board was established to explore "HKCNP community transformation model"
- 2014** "Love in Action" was launched to share resources, the care, love and gospel of Jesus Christ in the community, so as to transform lives
- 2016** "Youth Upward Mobility Program" was launched to connect the workplace and the society for life transformation
- 2018** "Post-Child Development Fund Program" (Post-CDF) was introduced

Expansion Stage Deepening relationships and collaborating through the network

- 2019** Since the outbreak of pandemic, HKCNP and our partners have launched multiple pandemic pilot schemes in response to the needs of the society by gathering various resources to help the underprivileged in the community
- 2020** HKCNP launched the "Church Space Transformation" ministry to encourage churches and religious groups to open their spaces, so as to deepen intra-community relationships
- 2021** Empowered our frontline partner institutes and churches to strengthen their community networks and connections, so as to further develop the Kingdom Asset Based Community Development (KABCD) HKCNP community transformation model collaboratively

Future Plans Strengthening the collaboration with our partners in poverty caring, network partnership and community transformation

- 2022+** Promote "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" (KABCD) to enhance its network services and transform communities through various modes of community transformation and connection between social capital and network in the hope that the underprivileged can live their lives to the fullest

Words from the Chairman

Mark 1:41 says, "Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I will; be thou clean." The theme of HKCNP's work this year is "Move with compassion, love and action", just like how Jesus served the poor: we were moved after we "saw" their needs, then we helped those needed to be cured with compassion and actions, and cleansed them mentally and spiritually with the love from the Lord.

The COVID-19 pandemic has continued for a period of time and has become the "new normal". Though the pandemic has yet to be ended, what we saw was that churches were still Kingdom-oriented, cared for the community and endeavoured to walk with the needy during this difficult time, which made me feel grateful and deeply moved.

Under volatile circumstances of the society, Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor (HKCNP) aspires to be a voice for the poor and supports churches in serving the underprivileged. We have endeavoured to achieve the missions of poverty caring, network partnership and community transformation. HKCNP has been advocating Kingdom Asset Based Community Development (KABCD) in recent years and promoting community transformation in the 18 districts in Hong Kong. With the power from the Lord, it is believed that we, as creations of the Lord, are valuable. By making use of individuals' gifts, we can become all that the Lord intends us to be, contribute to our community and sow the seeds of peace, joy and love collaboratively. Coordinated with HKCNP's advocacy and education work, such as the "Community Transformation Workshop - Christians' Response to Disparity between the Rich and the Poor" and "Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program - Advanced Training" which have been held for three years and two years respectively, we encourage pastors and Christians from different denominations and churches to embrace the same view on Kingdom and vision, learn from Jesus and lead the churches into the community. Churches collaborate through the network and serve the same Lord altruistically with a spirit of mutual aid.

HKCNP partnered with more than 910 units, including churches, institutes, schools and enterprises, with which mutual trust was built, close communication was kept and multiple pilot schemes, such as more than 20 poverty caring projects under Love in Action (including Love Prepaid Food Coupon, job matching platform, "A Glass of Water"

Unemployment Emergency Relief Fund, Social Caring Volunteer Subvention Voucher Program", Y Carecation, etc.) were developed to fill service gaps and fulfilled the immediate needs of the society. HKCNP also valued the service of "life transformation". Being the strategic partner of the government in the Child Development Fund Mentorship Program, we also promoted the culture of mentorship and the Youth Upward Mobility Mentorship Program in order to shape the life of youth while renewing the lives of Christians who worked as mentors and practicing the love from the Lord.

Thank the Lord for letting more churches and social groups embrace the beliefs of HKCNP, willing to consolidate and share resources, so as to form an extensive poverty alleviation network during this difficult time, which allowed HKCNP to establish a network and serve the public. Last but not least, we were particularly grateful to the three founding organizations of HKCNP - Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, Hong Kong Christian Council and Hong Kong Church Renewal Movement, for their prayers, support and spearheading the organization. I also encourage all of you to pray regularly for the poor, care for the needs of your neighbour, go into the community with actions and transform lives with grace and strength from God. May the Lord use HKCNP, our partners and fellows to move with compassion, love and action in the coming year, so as to show more underprivileged families the hope the Lord brings upon them.

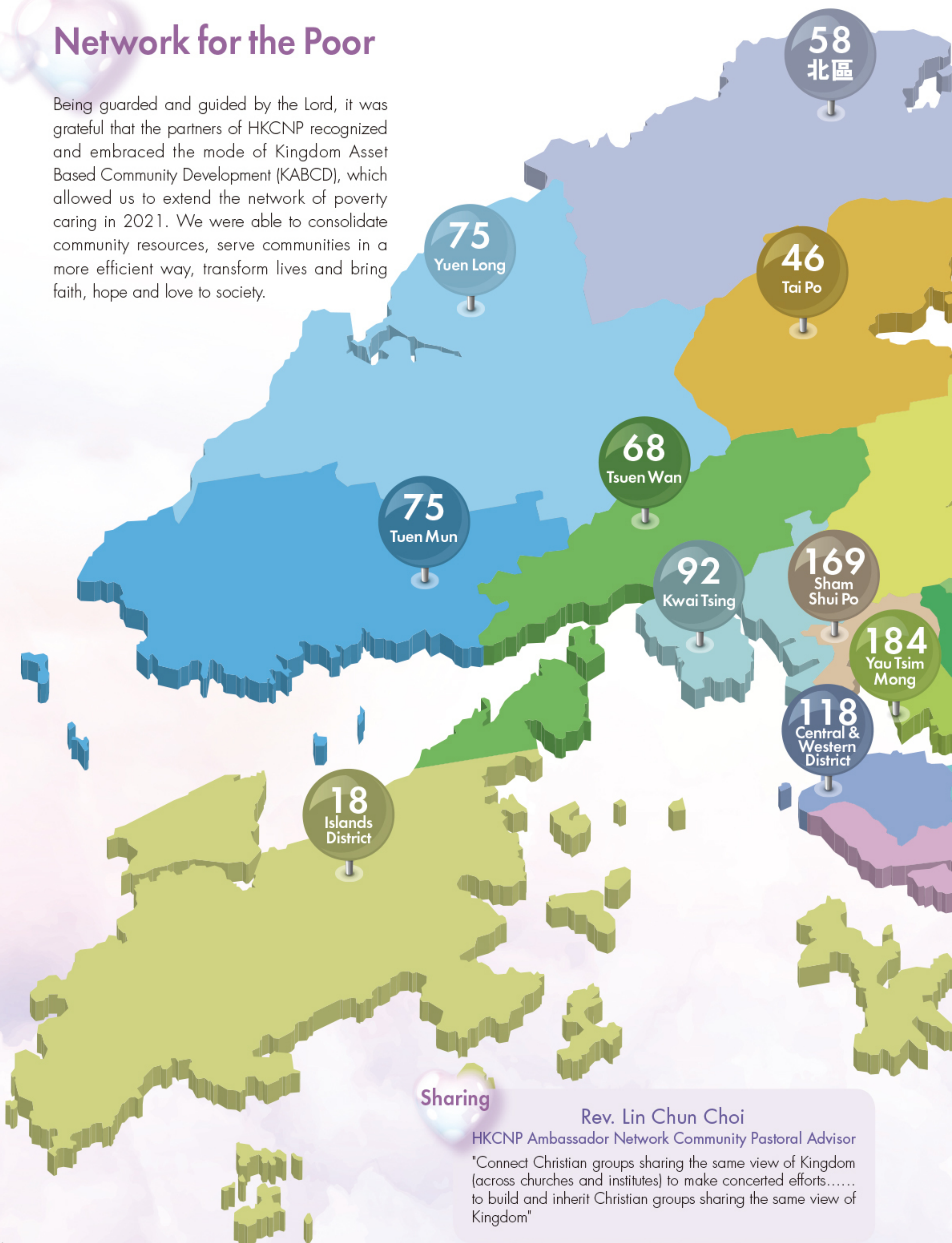

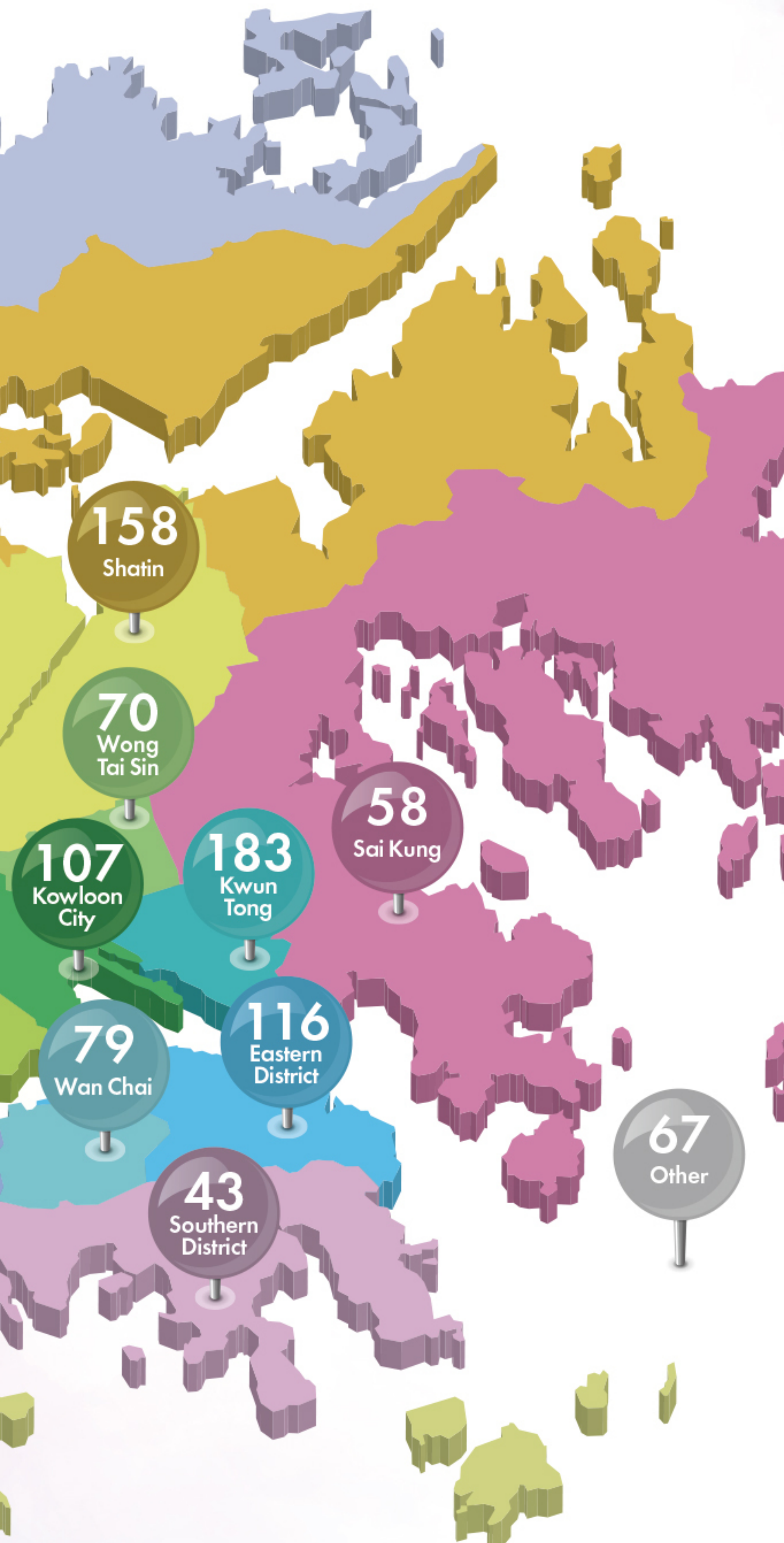

Stage 3

Implement the program

Stage target

- Formulated action plans for the network according to common goals, coordinated open-ended conversations, encouraged extensive participation and established common ownership.
- Set up individual working groups, set objectives, assigned roles, drew up a timetable together and continually evaluated project progress for each project.
- Set up a volunteer team through "ABCD Shui Chuen O Family Network". A graduation ceremony was organized in 2021 for more than 40 volunteers who had completed their training. Commenced a 3-year service in Shui Chuen O Estate.

Action timeline

- Led by HKCNP and Rev. Lin Chun Choi, the churches provided service from an asset-oriented perspective
- Made a service plan and drew up a timetable. Had meetings and prayer with core partners regularly. Provided services individually or jointly, such as taking part in PeaceBox Campaign and building relationships with service targets, as well as exploring resources in the community.
- Launched "ABCD Shui Chuen O Family Network" project with CUHK Nethersole School of Nursing in October 2020 to bring resources to Shui Chuen O

Indicators of success

- The goal was to set up volunteer teams for all 18 blocks of Shui Chuen O Estate. 14 volunteer teams had been set up, which consisted of core fellows of volunteers of the network. Closely liaised with the residents to learn about their needs. Visited and phoned them regularly, especially to the elderly singletons and doubletons.
- Enhanced community resilience and vitality, so as to face challenges with a positive and proactive attitude and mindset.
- Though the pandemic development was of grave concern, through the established clear structure, such as the long-term cooperation with mutual trust between core fellows and volunteers, the needs of the residents during the pandemic could be identified rapidly. They could contact churches immediately and receive appropriate support to prevail in this challenging period!

Conclusion

Although the pandemic had added tremendous burden to the underprivileged, through the established and repeatedly implemented networked community transformation, lives in the community were still hopeful during this difficult time. Community resilience and vitality were enhanced, and the community was able to face challenges with a positive and proactive attitude and mindset! Although fellows of the network were unable to visit and serve the residents in person when the pandemic development was of grave concern, they still sent their blessings and warmth to the local residents through various creative ways as they missed and cared for the residents. For instance, video clips were shot and edited by various units to cheer the residents up and provide them with contact details of churches, which allowed residents with urgent needs in Shui Chuen O to seek help from churches immediately. The needs of the residents during the pandemic were identified rapidly and received appropriate support!

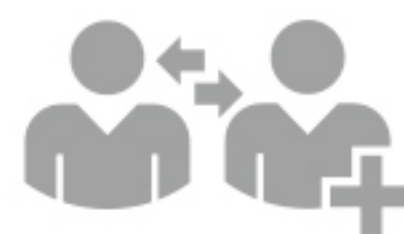

Case sharing: Implement KABCD in Yau Ma Tei

Preparation

In 2020, HKCNP Pastor Network Adviser Pastor Lai Kwong Chak (Allen Sir), who has been serving the church in Yau Ma Tei district for years, shared his experience regarding the huge physical, mental, social and spiritual needs of the underprivileged local residents in the district, as well as the community-centred vision with HKCNP, which just coordinated with "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development (KABCD)" that HKCNP has been promoting. We therefore partnered with the churches and Christians in the Yau Ma Tei network to start serving the community in Yau Ma Tei.

Explore resources pain

HKCNP conducted a survey in the district to find out the needs and resources of Yau Ma Tei district. Besides, HKCNP also gathered professional fellowships, partner churches, restaurants and brothers and sisters in the workplace, while Allen Sir liaised and cooperated with stakeholders like Yau Ma Tei Wholesale Fruit Market, owners of B&B and hotels to serve the community with their resources and establish a structure of service. Through the survey conducted, suitable manpower and resources were gathered and "HKCNP Community Ambassador Service Experience Program" was launched and became a platform to convene Christians to serve the community.

Mobilize the shalom community

Through organizing one-off experiential services, Christians with potential and the same visions were invited to participate in the Advanced Training of Community Ambassador Service Experience Program and were equipped in a more comprehensive and systematic way. They therefore would not just be delivering services but

could also learn about the philosophy and technique of planning long-term community transformation services. Visions and missions were delivered and more Christians with visions were trained to support churches in serving different communities.

Empowerment and self-contained

Not only transforming the life of beneficiaries, but also empowering the Christians who took part in the services to learn about how to walk with the underprivileged in the community, care for and build their lives, while training Christians to implement their lives as disciples in the community and be the witnesses of Christ.

Multiply network establishment

There were 14 and 19 trainees from 20 churches in the first and second Advanced Training respectively. It was expected that they would bring what they learnt back to their own communities, served the communities where their churches were located at, and encouraged more people to join them in serving the poor. In the beginning, Yaumati Kei To Church was the only church in the Yau Ma Tei network that participated in the service. Now there were 12 churches which worked together in the network to transform the community. May this ministry continue and the network establishment can be multiplied like "5 Loaves & 2 Fishes".

New Pandemic Relief Program in 2021



- **"A Cup of Cold Water" Unemployment Emergency Relief Fund**
Provided 133 underprivileged people whose job was affected by the pandemic with a one-time aid to meet their urgent needs and relieve their financial burden.
- **"Tablet and Notebook Computer Donation" Scheme**
919 tablets and notebook computers were gifted to help underprivileged students have online classes at home and have equal access to education.
- **Shared Space - Computer learning space**
Thanks to Christian Director Tang Hon Kwan and Principal Chan Yau Kwong Mother and Daughter Memorial Education Fund which is committed to assisting the underprivileged families and students in the society for setting up a shared space with Wi-Fi and computers using the space in church to let students have online classes there.
- **Masks and anti-epidemic items collection and donation**
When the pandemic development was of grave concern, HKCNP called for various sectors of the society to purchase, prepare and donate masks and anti-epidemic items to the underprivileged.
- **Social Caring Volunteer Coupon Subsidy Program**
Encouraged more churches to contact the underprivileged who were affected by the pandemic, walk with them and turn them into a giver rather than a receiver to transform the community.
- **HKCNP Job Matching Platform (Ended)**
HKCNP launched the Job Matching Platform and invited the business sector and institutes to provide vacancies so as to relieve the financial burden of the underprivileged.
- **E-Concept free online tutoring**
April 2021 (Co-organizer: E-Concept) 18 churches applied for the service, 51 students were matched with tutors and there were 71 tutoring applications in total.
- **Christian Care for Communities - Love Meal Coupon in Workplace Program (Phase III)**
April 2021 (Co-organizers: The Association of Christian Accountants, Financial Services Evangelistic Fellowship, Lawyers Christian Fellowship, Engineering & Construction Evangelical Fellowship) Love Food Coupons were donated by people in the workplace to support restaurants in the community. The food coupons were given to the underprivileged to fulfil their needs.
- **Y Carecation**
July 2021 (Co-organizer: YMCA of Hong Kong)
41 suffering underprivileged families were blessed and allowed to repose regardless of the pressure in life. At the same time, they were kept in good company with carers from churches.
- **Free hand sanitizers and wet wipes from Mannings**

Promote mentorship culture

HKCNP is committed to assisting the disadvantaged teenagers in development, allowing them to explore their potentials, find their passions and pursue their dreams and increasing their chance of achieving upward mobility and tackling the problem of inter-generational poverty in the long term. In order to help the teenagers, HKCNP has all along promoted the mentorship culture, encouraged Christians to become mentors, so as to work with the Lord and to walk with the teenagers. Based on the love of Jesus, the mentors can influence the lives of others with their own and provide pastoral care to the teenagers.

In 2007, HKCNP first launched the "Church Intensive Community Mentoring Pilot Program". The Government

adopted the model later in 2008 to establish the Children Development Fund (CDF), which aimed to offer long-term and sustainable help to the disadvantaged children aged 10-16. In 2016, HKCNP launched the Youth Upward Mobility Mentorship Program (YUM), which aimed to help the youth aged 18-25 overcome the difficulties they encountered regarding upward mobility, especially the disadvantaged and those with lower education levels. In 2018, HKCNP also launched the Post-Child Development Fund Program (Post-CDF) to provide mentees graduating from Child Development Fund Program with support for another two years, in the hope of extending the life nurturing campaign until the mentees graduate from secondary schools.

Child Development Fund Mentorship Program (CDF)

HKCNP has become a strategic partner of the Child Development Fund of the government since 2020. The role of HKCNP in the program was to empower our frontline partners, sponsor Mentee Matching Fund, help recruit mentors, provide resources, coordinate joint activities, share knowledge and experience, promote empirical studies and encourage churches to participate in community service.

HKCNP Pastor Network Adviser Rev. Erica Chan was the keynote speaker in 2019. The course was well-received and over a hundred pastors and Christian leaders participated in it. The latest course, targeting Christians, pastors, elders and deacons, was held again in 2021. Post-course meetings with Rev. Erica Chan were added, during which suggestions were given to the churches according to the proposals they handed in. HKCNP continued to support and provide guidance, including matching churches in the network for joint-church corporations, organizing community service workshops, providing resources for HKCNP Love in Action, joining 5 ministry service groups, etc.

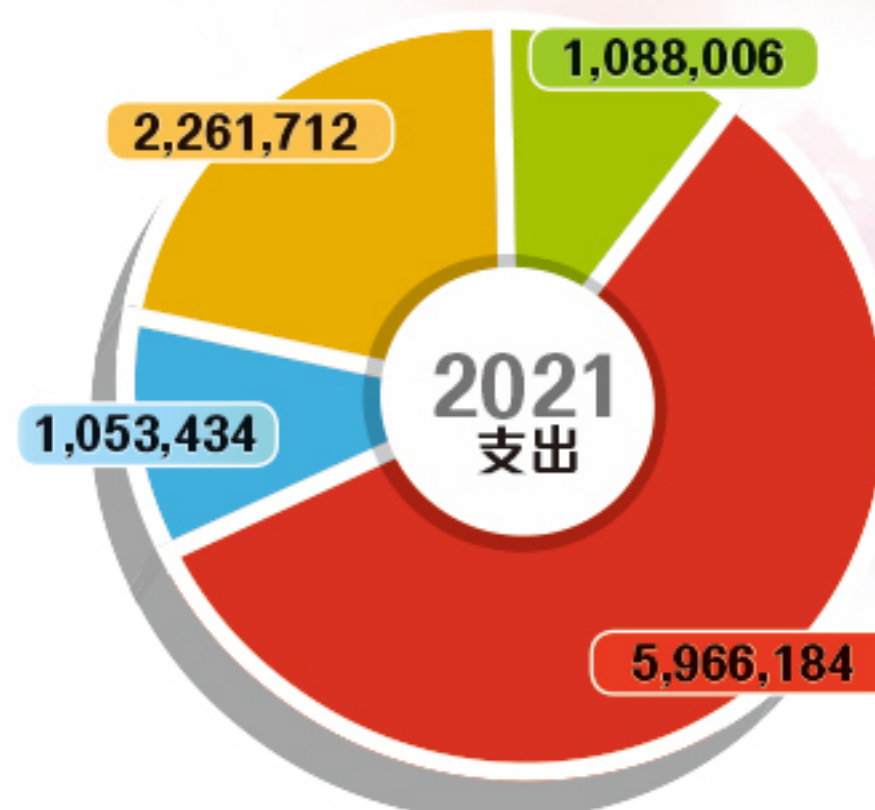
