Vision

Our Lord has heard the cry of the underprivileged people in Hong Kong, it's He who calls His people, sends them into communities of the poor: walk humbly with God, act justly and love mercy; speak according to the truth, act from a caring heart to manifest the witness of our church in trinity.

Mission

Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor (HKCNP) was founded by Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, Hong Kong Christian Council, Hong Kong Church Renewal Movement and a number of Christian NGOs, churches, and Christians who are serving the poor in the community. HKCNP is a network of community partners in collaboration to care for the poor to achieve community transformation. We focus on identifying service gaps with our partner churches and develop pilot programs to respond to needs. HKCNP provides knowledge-based, cared, and trustworthy services that focus on capacity building, empowerment, and mentorship. We gather community network resources to help and empower frontline partners to expand their service to reach more underprivileged groups, mobilize churches to care for the poor and fulfil God's Kingdom mission more effectively in the community.

The COVID-19 pandemic has continued for a period of time and the situation was still unstable in 2022. Although the pandemic has brought many challenges to the front-line community service, we were grateful that HKCNP and all the churches could take Christ as the leader, connect with each other, and pray together to seek the guidance of the Lord.

The theme of Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor's (HKCNP) work this year is "One Mind. One Heart. One God.". In order to establish a "Kingdom" network service team, commitment, trust, creativity and strategies of regional partners are needed, as well as the leadership of loyal Christian servant leaders, and more importantly, the partnership with God and our partners.

The annual report this year recorded how we, as a community network platform, identified service gaps with partner churches, developed multiple pilot schemes, consolidated community network resources, helped and empowered our frontline partners to expand services and be in contact with more deprived groups with physical, mental, social and spiritual needs in the past year, which allowed churches to bring God's kingdom to earth more effectively and fulfil the Great Commission. The "Christian's Response to Disparity between the Rich and the Poor Course" which was first launched by HKCNP has been held for six years by 2022. The course has been optimized to include church leaders, deepen follow-up work, continuously support and walk

with the church. The "Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program - Advanced Training" has been held for three years. This year, a graduate alumni association was established to gather Christians who were equipped with the "view of Kingdom" from all districts, empower churches and the community, and connect Christians across different denominations, churches and districts to serve the same Lord in unity.

Besides, HKCNP continued to help churches reach out to the community through more than 20 poverty-caring projects under Love in Action, while promoting the culture of mentorship and the Youth Upward Mobility Mentorship Program in order to shape the life of youth, become a blessing in the community, influence life with one another and let life transform the community.

Thank the Lord for letting more churches and social groups embrace the beliefs of HKCNP, which allowed HKCNP to establish a network and serve the public. Last but not least, we are particularly grateful to the three founding organizations of HKCNP - Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, Hong Kong Christian Council and Hong Kong Church Renewal Movement, for their prayers, support and spearheading the organization. 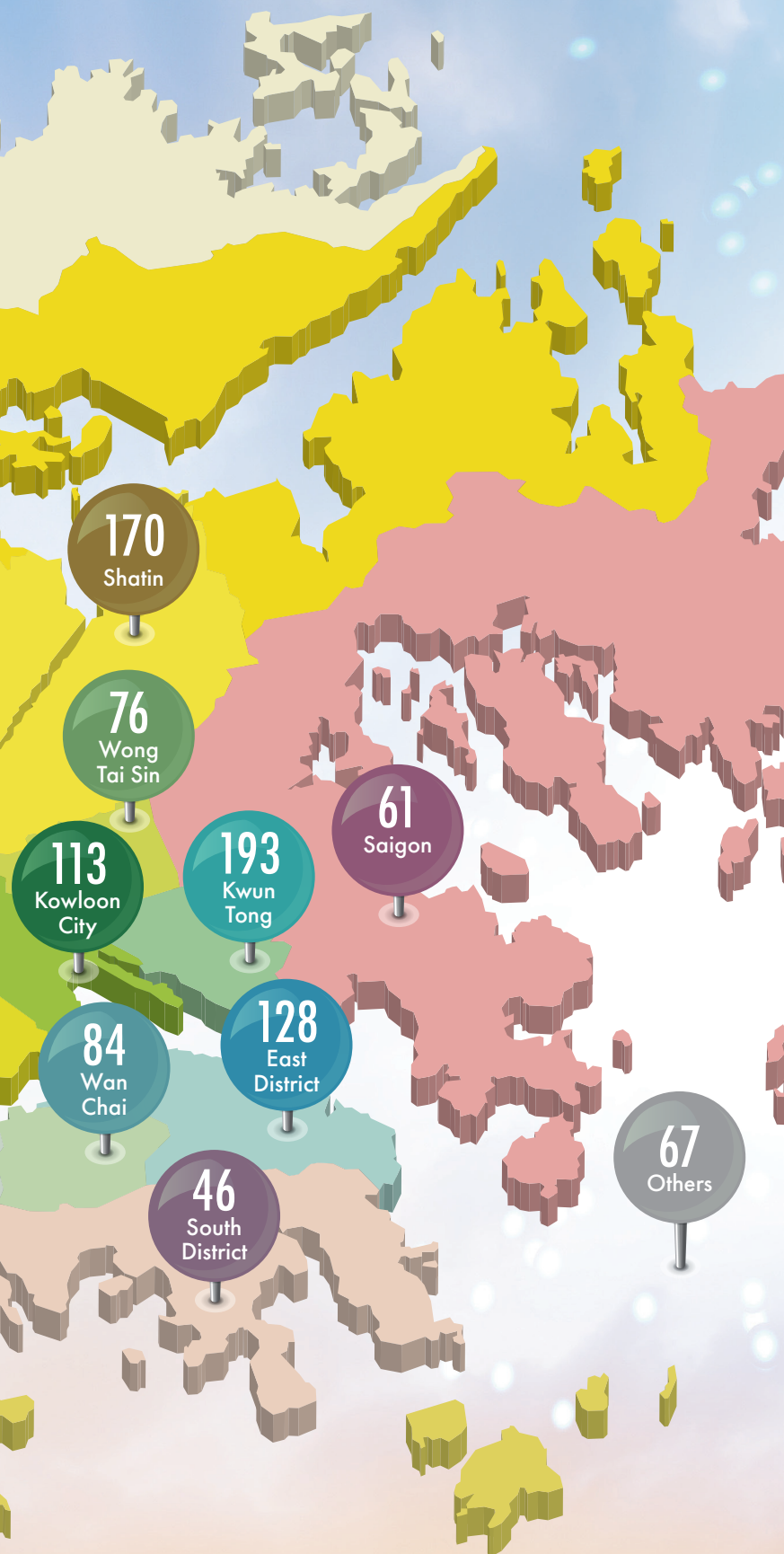

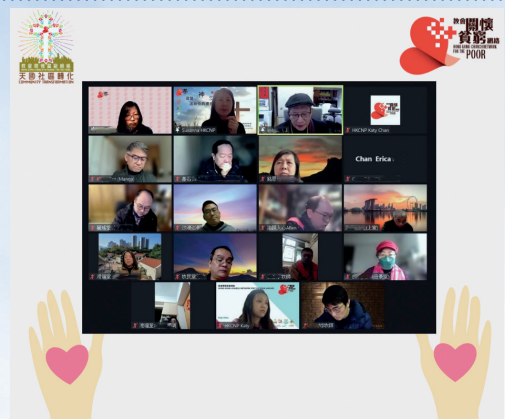


21 February 2022

HKCNP's network partnership during the pandemic

The challenges of the pandemic in recent years has once again hit Hong Kong society and the economy. Many people need holistic care to cater their physical, mental, social and spiritual needs. Rev. Li reminded us to pray persistently and bring hope to the underprivileged. Only the kingdom of God can give us real abundance and peace! Thank the Lord that all of the social caring actions of HKCNP still have a group of Lord, people and underprivileged loving pastors to surrender loyally and seek God's guidance through prayers. Moved by the same Holy Spirit and with one heart and one God, we respond to souls in need with faith, hope and love!

When the fifth wave of the pandemic was at its worst, many churches had to close. More than a dozen HKCNP network advisors from different communities gathered and prayed together via ZOOM. The pastors shared the difficulties encountered by the churches, such as: fellows could only serve to a limited extent due to the diagnosis of COVID-19. Despite the limitations, the churches continued to serve the community with feasible methods such as bargaining a discount with vegetable vendors for underprivileged families under home



quarantine temporarily; providing online homework guidance to underprivileged students, etc. Pastors were also willing to share resources with each other, such as emotional counseling service, testing kits donated by enterprises and medical advice, etc. Through sharing, we Christians were still demonstrating Christ's love and practicing our belief during the long epidemic.

After the meeting, we also agreed that at this time all Christians should be mobilized to serve neighbors in need, HKCNP therefore launched the "HK Caring Movement in Love" (see detail on page 20). It is hoped that HKCNP will continue to be a platform full of God's grace, gather and inspire love, and encourage good deeds!

28 June 2022

HKCNP directors, executive committee members and advisors retreat

Thank the Lord. 25 HKCNP directors, executive committee members, advisors and fellows retreat together to quietly seek God's face and His will. Recall their original aspiration and experience the Lord by serving the poor with "Compassion, love and action" and bring transformation to Christians themselves. Kingdom Asset Based Community Development (KABCD) - District Version

Empower the underprivileged and build a Kingdom community with sustainable transformation and resilience!

A process empowered by God, in which the people of a community grow in their ability to solve their own problems and manage their lives resulting in growth of the whole person (physical, psychological, spiritual) and improvement of the various aspects of their community. Through this process the individuals and the community become all that God intends them to be.



KABCD in North District (Sheung Shui and Fanling)

The northern part of the New Territories is one of the key development areas of the government in the next 20 years with the target of a metropolitan area that can accommodate about 2.5 million people to live, work, and travel. As communities have been established, we are seeing that residents are facing various challenges. But it is also an opportunity for Christians and churches to let the gospel transform lives. Lives then transform communities, and bring God's Kingdom to earth.

Core members of NT North District Survey: Rev. Lee Hoi Ping, Prof. Wong Hung, Mr. Tang Chi Kong

Since 2021, HKCNP has received the Lord's vision to serve the needy residents in North District. We have been praying for a network convener who embraces the same vision with HKCNP to lead and form a network to serve.

Rev. Lee Hoi Ping, pastors, deacons and six social caring division brothers and sisters from Sheung Shui Evangelical Church have benefited a lot from the Christian's Response to Disparity between the Rich and the Poor Course held by HKCNP in 2021. They brought the messages and visions back to the church network in North District and invited fellows of HKCNP to introduce the course and the feasibility of conducting a survey in North District in the future during the staff meeting of Christian North District Chinese Association (CNDCA).

The staff members agreed to partner with HKCNP and hold courses in North District for church leaders to learn, communicate, share visions of community service. Therefore, since November 2021, "Transforming lives in Community, Renovating Churches in North District" Kingdom Asset Based

Community Development Course (KABCD)" had been held. In the course, we had HKCNP Ambassador Network Community Pastoral Advisor Rev. Chan Suk Kuen and HKCNP partner churches from different districts shared their experience in community service. HKCNP also took this opportunity to contact churches for the potential to support the development of the churches in North District by coordinating different resources. It was grateful that 12 churches under CNDCA in North District participated in this course, and moved to be equipped to underprivileged service in the district.





With the resources from HKCNP Love in Actions, many churches in North District carried out and optimized community services to bless the underprivileged in the community after the lessons, such as Love Prepaid Meal Coupon, Social Caring Volunteer Coupon Subsidy Program and HKCNP Anti-epidemic Fund, through which the churches expanded their service network to more underprivileged people and built closer relationships with them. For instance, Kowloon Tong Alliance Church Fanling Church organized the Queen's Hill partnership program through PeaceBox. At the same time, churches in the district cooperated with each other to obtain more resources. Rev. Lee Hoi Ping, chairman of CNDCA, became HKCNP Ambassador Network Community Pastoral Advisor and Network Convenor of North District to help HKCNP promote KABCD in North District to encourage more churches to serve together!

In November 2022, HKCNP led the churches in North District to conduct a community survey. With training and community research, churches understood the needs of North District better and responded to social needs. We devoted in our prayer walks to ask for God's leadership. And then, we established a core team for the development of Queen's Hill,

connecting 5 churches, community organizations and schools in the district to serve together. A service network is established with the support of HKCNP anti-epidemic resources. HKCNP also connected the churches in North District and Mr. Tang Chi Kong, who works in a government infrastructure engineering consultant company, to be HKCNP District Development Advisor. Together with Prof. Wong Hung from the Department of Social Work of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, we conduct a North District community survey in the fourth quarter of 2022. The community survey helped the churches better formulate service projects with an improved understanding of poverty problems and the needs of the underprivileged.



With the help of the connection between HKCNP and the organizations in the district, more brothers and sisters are involved in leading more local residents to church activities participated. The churches in North District built and renewed the lives of Christians through continuous service. For instance, through community service, Kowloon Tong Church Sheung Shui Church established their church vision and connected with different churches. Through long term service for the underprivileged, churches understand God's will on them and align community service with faith. Churches learnt to become One in God and serve our neighbors

Church of Holy Calling in Fanling got in touch with elders during the epidemic and empowered them by training them to become volunteers in Queen's Hill. Though interviews, the Church on The Rock Yan Shing Church encouraged women to become each other's companion to share their blessing and understand each other's difficulties; Christian & Missionary Alliance Living Stones Church formed parent support groups and board game activity groups with women volunteers, eventually leading to more families participating in the service. The churches empowered the underprivileged beneficiaries with training and nurturance to continue serving others.

With the development of the northern metropolitan area, HKCNP has also begun to search for different resources to form a North District network. Facing uncertainty and changes, HKCNP's networking and accompany have become a synergy for the development of North District. In November 2022, at the sharing session by minister-in-charge of CNDCA, Rev. Lee Hoi Ping shared the service project in Queen's Hill, encouraging 60 churches to participate and accomplish the God's Commission together. We are looking forward to our North District network partners to enter the stage of Empowerment and Multiply network establishment in 2023, to build a unique resilience and transform North District to a community with mutual support, love, sharing, one heart and one God!



In 2023, we will continue to walk with the Holy Spirit, utilize our creativity to empower life, transform and multiply our network in North District. HKCNP will continue to mobilize cooperation for district-based networking services all over Hong Kong. You are sincerely invited to contact HKCNP and serve your community with us!

Kingdom Asset Based Community Development (KABCD) - Workplace Fellowship Version

Workplace Love Prepaid Meal Coupon Scheme KABCD

Core members : The Association of Christian Accountants, Financial Services Evangelistic Fellowship Limited, Lawyers Christian Fellowship, Engineering & Construction Evangelical Fellowship

Preparation

HKCNP received a phone call from Thomas Lau, who has a small accounting firm in the Mongkok area, about our Love In Action (LIA) restaurant coupon program. In February 2019, with the first outbreak of COVID, the Government restricted the service hours and capacity of restaurants and many small restaurants were struggling. At the same time, many of the NGOS that used to distribute free food in the city stopped their services since they wanted to protect their social workers. Many of our partner churches were only giving out food once a week to fill the service gaps. With many people without food, the service gap grew and so too the church services. Our church pastors were desperately in need of food resources and came to HKCNP for help. We reviewed the situation and decided to launch the LIA restaurant coupon program by paying each church \$3000 to buy 100 lunch boxes from local small (non-chained) restaurants in their area. The churches then have the free lunch boxes to distribute to the poor in their districts. So it is

a win (for the church), a win (for the poor), and a win (for small business owners). HKCNP's role is to advocate the service gap and raise funds for the churches to buy the coupons. HKCNP also helped set up the whole process and taught the pastors the logistics of creating the coupons, making pre-payments, tracking the coupons, and following up with the recipients and the restaurant owners.



Explore resource pain

Thomas heard about the program and wondered whether his CPA firm could participate in getting funding from HKCNP to buy restaurant coupons around his office. I told Thomas the key to the program is the follow-up of the recipients and he did not have the resources to do so. I told him to pray about it, and seek partnership from the Association of Christian Accountants (ACA) that he belongs to, and from his church. Later, he called me and praised God for the support of ACA in raising funds for the coupons and recruiting volunteers to distribute the coupons with a gospel message. We have contacts with other Christian fellowships and I encouraged him to seek their partnership too. With the power of networking, three other Christian fellowships

joined the campaign and we identified two districts to serve together. With that, HKCNP recruited our partner churches in those districts to assist the professional Christians in the whole campaign and those in charge of following up with the coupon recipients.



Mobilizing the shalom community

We started the first batch in September 2020 with 227 people accepting Christ and HKCNP led the partners in the whole event. The team was on fire and we decided to have two batches of coupon distribution in November 2020. HKCNP started to transfer the operational role to the fellowships and we trained them in how to do it. As the Christian fellowship served together in this program, they started to build relationships and trust. With the huge unemployment in the city, they started to partner in other programs utilizing their professional expertise and networks in serving in our ways.





Empowerment and self-containment

The network continues to grow and the volunteers were empowered by the Holy Spirit during their service. They then recruited more volunteers (such as co-workers and family members) to help and the non-believing volunteers got to witness the love of Christ before they accepted Christ during the event. Christian volunteers then shared the experiences with their churches and encouraged other church members to join. At the same time, the network hired a HKCNP pastor partner as a consultant to teach and lead the volunteer services. As we build more structure and roles in the partnership, the campaign continues to grow and the network is about to

transfer the service opportunities to more churches. One of the volunteers shared that he was overwhelmed with joy when seven people accepted Christ at the same time on the street and he felt truly blessed.



Multiplying network establishment

Praise God the campaign network continues to grow and we just had our batch 5 celebration, thanking all the partners in the community transformation. We share God's transformation within the Christian Fellowship in the community. God's miracles grew the Christian fellowship community and transformed the lives of all those involved. Some volunteers served each week because of their personal encounters with God on the street and they realized

many people need God in this difficult time. They said the restaurant coupon is a way of reflecting God's love to the poor and they enjoy service with other volunteers from different churches. They sense God is doing new things and they are excited to encounter God in their service trips. As the volunteers gather in parks and street sharing, demonstrating the love of Christ, we witness His Kingdom among the poor and the hope they received in Christ!

Mr. Thomas Lau, HKCNP Ambassador Network Community Advisor, said, "The darkest time is also the time to see the light of humanity! When everyone is afraid and want to stay home, a group of dedicated people in the workplace go out to the community and serve the grassroots in the community to deliver love! We learn that humility and listening to the needs of the grassroots is just as important as genuine concern and a meal ticket. We learn to be humble and listen to the needs of the grassroots. Communities should connect, support, and respect each other with love, regardless of wealth! God's wisdom is wonderful, not only for the grassroots to taste the Lord's grace, but also for the working class to taste the Lord's goodness!

HKCNP Love in Action

We saw the physical, mental, social, and spiritual needs of the underprivileged, and how the local churches have been serving the local residents. "Love in Action" connected organizations, individuals and groups, and provided free resources to become medium and starting point to support long-term transformative service of our partners to the grassroots. From there we practiced Christ's love and transformed lives with the gospel.

God is a bridge to build relationships, so that every participant can experience that God is with, and living with us."

An underprivileged beneficiary shared: "It was not about the content or value of these packages, but the 'Love' and 'Care' I felt."

In 2022, through 22 "Love in Action" resources, HKCNP continued to support churches to reach out to the underprivileged, deepen relationships and provide pastoral care in the long run. HKCNP strive to identify service gaps and develop "Love in Action" pilot schemes in response to the needs with our partner churches. This survey results help optimize the projects according to the current situation, improve understanding and respond to the needs of the underprivileged and the community. HKCNP use resources effectively to empower and walk with churches, recipients and the community under the grace of the Lord!

In 2022, HKCNP contacted partner churches in the 18 districts of Hong Kong who had participated in HKCNP Love in Action to conduct a service effectiveness survey. We conducted group interviews with 31 pastors, brothers and sisters in charge of community services, and 44 recipients who had received church services and participated in Love in Action (for more details, please scan the QR code). We were grateful that the results reflected our partners' efforts and its fruitful outcome.

The main survey results reflected that the follow-up services of the "Love in Action" partner churches could positively impact the beneficiaries and the churches on the following aspects:

- ✔ Alleviating social poverty
- ✔ Deepening the understanding of Christianity
- ✔ Transformation from beneficiary to helper
- ✔ Targeted responses to the food, social, and parent-child needs of the underprivileged
- ✔ Connecting churches with beneficiaries
- ✔ Comprehensive support for service participants
- ✔ Helping church members practice the mission of faith and growth of Christian's life



Dr. Vincent Lee Wan Ping, HKCNP Advocacy, Education and Research Team core member, shared:

(Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, Hong Kong Baptist University, HKCNP Advocacy, Education and Research Team core member)

"The survey results showed that continuous visits after activities and emotional support from churches were the main positive factors to their satisfaction with the Love in Action and church activities. From the analysis of the focus group interviews, we can see that the underprivileged interviewees felt the kindness and caring, and were satisfied and grateful for the services and various support provided by the churches.

Even though the churches were unable to fully solve their problems and needs in life, they had already helped them overcome the helplessness in life to a large extent. Churches' guidance on parenting, parent-child relationship, awareness of community support and services, interpersonal network expanding, etc. had given them great emotional support and self-confidence.

The survey result should be a significant revelation for my church's future service of a community center in the Southern District. Although for underprivileged residents, material support can indeed meet their daily needs, they may benefit more from

personal emotional and interpersonal support. The most they lack is often social capital. The shortage of social capital is limiting their ability to live autonomously in the long run, such as finding suitable jobs and benefiting from available social resources.

By connecting them with companions in the community, they can support each other. In the process of establishing and maintaining this kind of mutual-help community, if we can keep following up the empowerment of these underprivileged families, the community center and workshop established by the church in the future can play an important role in the well-being of residents."

Mentorship culture

HKCNP is committed to assisting the growth of disadvantaged teenagers. We help them to explore their potentials, passions and to pursue their dreams, increasing their chance of achieving upward mobility and break away from inter-generational poverty in the long term. In order to help the teenagers, HKCNP has been encouraging Christians to become mentors, to work with the Lord and walk with the teenagers. Let the love of Jesus influence the lives of teenagers through mentorship culture.

Milestones of mentorship culture promotion through HKCNP network

2007	First launched the "Community Mentoring Program for the Next Generation"
2008	The government adopted the model to establish the Child Development Fund (CDF) Program, which aimed to offer long-term support to underprivileged children aged 10-16.
2016	HKCNP launched the Youth Upward Mobility Mentorship Program (YUM) with partner enterprises, which aimed to help youth aged 18-25 overcome the difficulties regarding upward mobility, especially for the underprivileged and those with lower education attainment.
2018	Post-Child Development Fund Program (Post-CDF) was launched to provide mentees graduating from Child Development Fund Program with support for another two years, in the hope of extending the life nurturing campaign until the mentee graduate from secondary schools.
Since 2020	HKCNP has become a strategic partner of the Child Development Fund of the government. The role of HKCNP in the program includes empowering our frontline partners, sponsoring Mentee Matching Fund, recruiting mentors, providing resources, coordinating joint activities, sharing knowledge and experience, promoting empirical studies, encouraging churches to participate in community service, etc.
Early 2021	"YUM Community Organizer Pilot Program" was developed, which was a new social caring model combining mentorship and social service. The church was responsible for training and nurturing youth to contribute to the church's frontline social service. By inviting pastors to serve as mentors, we hoped that the youth could establish positive values, and enhance their spirituality and quality of mind.
2022	HKCNP launched an updated version of the "YUM Church Youth Community Organizer Pilot Program", inviting partner churches to participate, helping them to expand community service and benefiting underprivileged youth.

Especially with support in resources, the churches are more willing to make bold and creative service...and also let the elders, deacons and members see the effectiveness of the program...let the church discover more possibilities to serve!"

Three months have passed, and even though the program is ended, I will continue to serve the children in my own time, so that the relationships can be maintained. I would pass on the spirit of Community Organizer and bring love, tolerance, sincerity, responsibility, commitment and support to the community."



Advocacy and education

Serving Opportunities under the Pandemic and Bring Christianity in Community Sharing Session

HKCNP has held "Christian's Response to Disparity between the Rich and the Poor Course" for several years. More than 20 churches learnt together from scratch to strengthen the communication between servants and the served, as well as the cooperation and training among team members.

During the sudden fifth wave of the epidemic in the beginning of 2022, it's grateful that churches still actively accompany the underprivileged local residents. The churches must be flexible in order to serve the needy groups under constraints and challenges. Therefore, HKCNP held the "Serving Opportunities under the Pandemic and Bring Christianity in Community Sharing Session" on 24th March 2022, inviting 7 churches, who completed the course, to share how their learning and experience helped them build resilience, play the role of community churches, to follow the Lord's teachings and live out our faith despite the epidemic.

Nearly 200 church leaders, brothers and sisters participated in the sharing session. Rev. Chan Suk Kuen, a HKCNP Ambassador

Network Community Pastoral Advisor, shared that in spite of the challenge of the epidemic, the church still empathizes with the hardships of the beneficiaries and explored room for support. By promoting cross-church and cross-denominational cooperation, churches actively explored opportunities to serve the community with organizations.

7 churches in different sizes shared the challenges and breakthroughs of serving the community from multiple perspectives. The testimonies not only greatly encouraged and moved Christians to serve the community in the epidemic with love and hope, but also provided practical examples and scenes for the reference of churches. HKCNP strived to walk with churches. We held courses to help churches to plan community services, with following up and resources networking. The sharings of the 7 churches were the testimonies of God's blessing to multiply the network.

Rev. Chan Suk Kuen, HKCNP Ambassador Network Community Pastoral Advisor, shared: "Churches of different denominations cooperated with each other, shared resources and utilized the characteristics and gifts of each church. They selflessly reach out to the community together. The blessed are not only the local residents, but also the churches."

HK Caring Movement in Love

HKCNP launched the "HK Caring Movement in Love" on 2nd March. During the most severe period of the fifth wave of the epidemic, every Christian was encouraged and mobilized to pray for God's will during Lent, and care for three underprivileged people through phone calls or actions to understand their needs, response to their deficiencies in actions and prayers.

From 4th March, HKCNP held a weekly online training course for caring the underprivileged for 6 consecutive weeks to equip the participants with skills and mentality, so that they could become the light of Christ and spread His love in the epidemic to their neighbors, fulfilling the Great Commission! We are thankful for the grace of God, as well as the support and promotion from all partners. More than 470 brothers and sisters participated in the training course, which multiplied the blessings to the community under the epidemic.



Sister Eunice from Evangelical Free Church of China Yan Fook Church, a participant of the training course, shared:

"The enthusiasm of the fellows from HKCNP has moved me to care for the underprivileged people affected by the epidemic. Participating in the "HK Caring Movement in Love" course, I can learn some practical knowledge, so that brothers and sisters can turn love into action. I hope to have more opportunities to serve in the future and spread the love of the Lord to the society."

Church Space Transformation Ministry

Encourages churches and religious groups to share their spaces to the community. Through action, we deepen intra-community relationships with mutual, support and empower partners to make good use of community space. We hope the spirit of sharing can be promoted and space resources can be used more effectively to serve the poor.

It was grateful that since December 2021, the Church Space Transformation Fellowship of HKCNP has been established to gather pastors to pray and share experience and resources with each other for the practice of "Space Sharing". Welcome the churches that were preparing for this ministry to participate.

Rev. Chow Lik Wing of Yogoo also shared: "Under 'One body one church', we helped Christians find their 'share' that can be dedicated to the church. The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. We expect more churches to mobilize more laborers to accomplish the holy work."

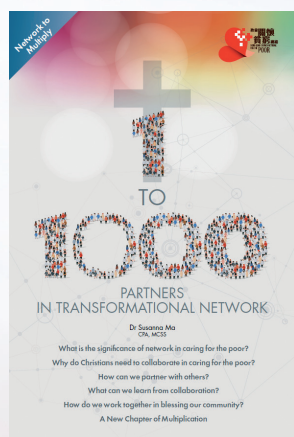

Advocacy and education

Anti-poverty campaign of HKCNP

Since 2012, in response to the United Nations' "International Day for the Eradication of Poverty" on 17th October, HKCNP has encouraged partner churches to jointly witness the Lord Jesus' care for the poor through sermons and services by holding 10.10.10 Anti-Poverty Campaign. At the same time, 10.17 Anti-Poverty Campaign was launched to encourage the public, schools and enterprises to pay attention to the needs of the poor. On 17 October 2022, we held an online version of "10.17 Fast-a-Meal" Against Poverty Day to encourage people from all walks of life to skip a meal during lunch time and participate in a spiritual agape meal online. Through spiritual meditation, testimony sharing, release of HKCNP Love in Action Effectiveness Report and major findings sharing, the public was encouraged to think about poverty issues and to respond to the needs of the community!

The sharing guests in the gathering came from different sectors, including churches, enterprises, professionals, etc. With real

testimonies, they inspired over 90 participants to continue to care for the poor with persistence and love. One of the fellows shared a testimony of how to let both the underprivileged youth and himself grow up through care and love; a couple also shared a true story of learning to serve an underprivileged family through 20 years of hard work, and God's blessing in their service; some lawyers and enterprises shared how to use their own abilities and resources to respond creatively to the needs of the community even when they are facing limitation; a woman shared with church pastors about how the Lord transformed the life of every underprivileged, how she recognized her identity and dignity as a precious child of God, made good use of her gifts, and became a blessing to the church and others.



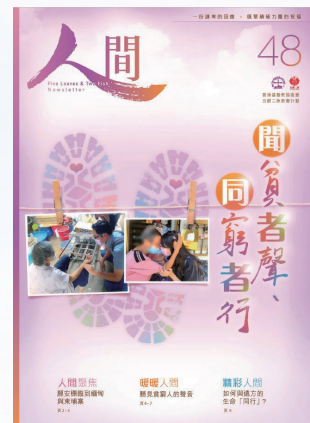

Advocated and educated Christians to care for the poor through the Youtube channel and "Five Loaves & Two Fish Newsletter" of Hong Kong Christian Council



HKCNP networked partner churches and organizations to participate in district transformation service.

On 16 October 2022, HKCNP partnered with Rotary Club of Star Avenue to hold the Starlight Show of Love in Sau Mau Ping Estate, Kwun Tong. Volunteers from Rotary Club of Star Avenue, Link shopping mall, engineering companies, St. John Ambulance Brigade and Scouts participated in the service. Ms Rebecca Koo, Kwun Tong District Social Welfare Officer of SWD also attended to support. The Rotary Club cooperated with CNEC Kei Shek Social Service Centre, a HKCNP partner who served underprivileged people for years, to distribute consumption vouchers and some supplies to underprivileged residents, so as to ease the economic pressure of small shops and the general public under the epidemic. Through cooperation of different units, the manpower and resources of all parties could be well-coordinated and allocated to help those in need. Local residents could relax and get closer to each other, improving community integration.





HK Christian Doctor Network

HKCNP has been cooperating with Dr. Albert Siu Huen, a HKCNP Network Advisor, and HK Christian Doctor Network to bless the community with medical expertise and empower the HKCNP partner church network. In 2022, we jointly organized "Agape Healthcare x HKCNP : Holistic Care Ambassador Training Course" to train volunteers to care for the underprivileged holistically and build a Healing Community. In addition, every year, medical students from the University of Hong Kong will be networked to HKCNP for internship.

"During family visits, I had two experiences. The first one was about human weakness. The second experience was about **"do not fail to commit an act of kindness just because it is small in**

scale". From the joy of the beneficiary families today, it can be seen that serving is not just about giving material support, but more importantly, expressing care. Therefore, even if we are weak and unable to do good deeds, don't forget to do good deeds to the best of our abilities! Believe that God has His own arrangement in it... I need to understand this even more when I become a doctor in the future. When communicating with patients, I really need to give them warmth, not just cure them. I hope that in the future I can become a doctor who can heal both the body and mind."

Tertiary institutions and seminaries

23 students from different tertiary institutions participated in the summer internship at HKCNP and served in frontline social caring service with HKCNP partner churches. With that, they understood more on poverty and gained knowledge and skills in caring for the poor. HKCNP hopes to train interns to go into the community and care about their needs with empathy, and become servant leaders in the future, to encourage and motivate others to care, love and transform lives and the city we live in.

Response from a pastor from The Church of Grace in Resurrection, our partner church:

"(The church) was particularly lively today because two young and promising volunteers from HKCNP came. They are from CUHK. Through HKCNP, they experienced the frontline work of poverty alleviation. Yesterday they came to our community service center to learn about the frontline services and experience how the education center teaches underprivileged children. Internalization is the best life education. No matter in study, talents or character, children can learn better with the teacher's teaching and demonstration. It happened to be a rainy day, the interns took the initiative to take floor mops to help clean up the water stains, as role models with words and actions."



Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program and Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program - Advanced Training

One-time experience programs let Christians or churches to reach out to the community to serve people. The advanced training program provides systematic and comprehensive community service training. It has been held for three years as of 2022. More than 40 students have graduated. They did not only walk into the community (Yau Ma Tei), but also brought their reflections back to churches and shared them with brothers and sisters, so as to promote churches to embrace the visions and transform the community.

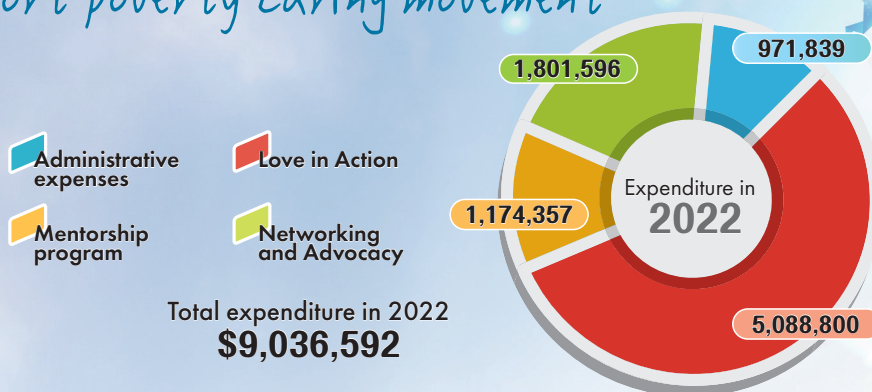

Sharing by Heidi (seminary student, intern)

"I was particularly impressed when I visited the cleaners at the garbage station. The environment was poor, the smell was strong, and the weather was hot. Due to work, the cleaners would stay there to eat... If it wasn't for this visit, I would not have had the opportunity to take the initiative to walk into the garbage station and see how hard they were. We looked at the cleaners with gratitude and respect. Although we could only offer a few supplies and listen to them sharing their living conditions, we expressed a small amount of care and let them feel that they have not been neglected and forgotten by the society. During the internship, I deeply realized the importance of cooperation between different churches and institutions. Embracing a common belief, they served the underprivileged citizens, coordinated and collaborated with each other, practiced the concept of sharing resources and space, so that resources were allocated and appropriate help in daily life was provided to those who were really in need. Especially during the epidemic, they saw the needs of the society, mobilized volunteers to participate in community services and did their part to serve the community.
