


### Hong Kong Poverty Statistics

According to analysis of the poverty situation in Hong Kong in 2016 :

- Population living in poverty : 995,800人
- Households in poverty : 412,400
- Children below 18 y.o.: 172,000人

#### Which districts are the poorest?





Analysis of poverty situation in Hong Kong in 2016

#### Sham Shui Po (SSP) Poverty Situation

- SSP current population = approx. 400,000
  Family households = approx. 148,000
- Median income = \$22,000
  (Hong Kong median income = \$26,500)
- Population 14 y.o. & below = 49,300 (12.3%)
- Population between 15–24 y.o. = 40,500 (10.01%)
- According to Hong Kong Poverty Situation Report 2016 :
- > SSP poverty population = 63,200 (Family households = 25,400)
- Single parent households = 8.5%
  New immigrant households=5.8% (both higher than other districts)
- Families with children & Working poor households are 34.7% and 37.5% respectively
- Population on CSSA = 21.5% (highest among 18 districts)

# Living Environment

- Subdivided flats, partitioned rooms
- Gross area of subdivided flats ranges from 7-13 m<sup>2</sup>
- Kitchen and washroom usually in the same area; sleeping, eating and studying are usually on the bed
- Limited space for children directly affects their growth





# Food/Nutrition

- According to a survey of dietary conditions of grassroots children from the People Service Centre, among 216 children from Sham Shui Po, Yau Tsim Mong, Kowloon City, Wong Tai Sin, Tuen Mun families, about 17.6% have experienced 'hunger', 'eating one meal less' or 'not eating for the whole day'.
- Inadequate kitchen, only one burner stove and rice cooker; poor ventilation, can only cook simple meals
- To save money, usually purchase less or no meat

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




# Study Issues
